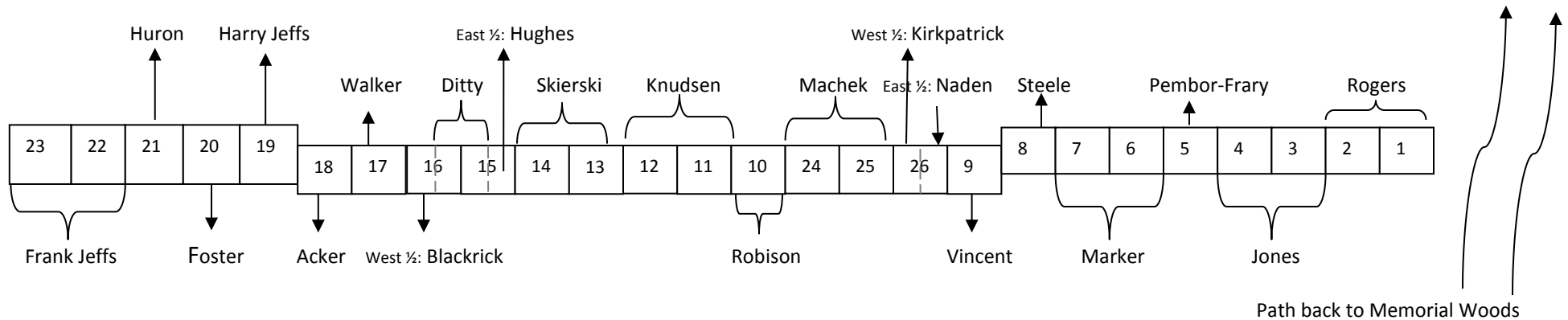


Crystal Lake Township Cemetery North

Historical Notes:

- As of July 2008, no exact measurements for all these plots were found in Township records. It was and still is assumed that they are each 6-10 deep and 12-16 wide, containing enough space for 4 full burials (coffins.) However, working measurements of boxed off/numbered lots actually vary widely. Each numbered box is assumed to be able to bury 4 full burials but in most cases this is proving problematic.
- A historic map, discovered in the township hall basement in 2018, depicted the eastern-most section, which included 4 foot walk every two lots. For working purposes going forward, these walkways are no longer recognized. Some new, modern markers were installed to show northern-most corners.
- #9 through 18 were overlooked for sale until late 1990's, presumably because of problems with geographic features. The township board at the time stepped up efforts to sell these plots, which they did successfully, but did not re-survey, place new corner markers, give measurements nor provide a working map. It was quickly found that burials, especially full burials, are sometimes not possible due to –among many factors– “perched” terrain, roots from trees, and access road (driving required over the dead).
- #2 was originally J. Patterson.
- #20 was originally Joseph Smith, then Harry Jeffs, then Robert & Phyllis Foster.
- East ½ of 15 originally Vieau but in 2015 family exchanged for plots in Section J-135 and Jack Hughes bought East ½ 15.
- Skierskis originally bought 12, 13 & 14, then deeded over #12 to in-laws, the Robisons. Sexton mis-located burial of Robison in #10, so in 2019 all parties agreed to moving Knudsen lots to the west (now #11 & 12) and deeding Robison #10 instead.
